Greetings:

We have gotten off to an outstanding start of the 2011-2012 school year, with great enthusiasm and excellent courtesy and respect demonstrated throughout the building. Preliminary enrollment numbers are very encouraging, as our current number of kindergarten students exceeds the number of seniors who graduated last May by more than ten and the number of families and students who are new to our district exceeds the number of families and students who moved from Martensdale-St Marys to attend school elsewhere by a significant number. We are cautiously optimistic, but won't know the actual enrollment for 2011-2012 until the official October 1 'count day'.

As this will be the last formal district communication to you before the September 13, 2011 school board election date, I want to remind and encourage you to exercise your civic duty and responsibility and VOTE for your district board member representatives. Mrs. Nicole Bunch, current school board president, is running for District 5 re-election and Mr. Dean Furness is running for the expired District 3 board member seat, currently held by Mr. Scott Anderson, who has decided not to run for another term.

For the past three months, I have been encouraging you to help us improve our efforts to provide timely and meaningful information to you. This will be my final request for those of you who have not already done so to complete the short communications survey that the district communications committee has developed. You will be able to access and complete the communications survey electronically as a **link** on the Martensdale-St. Marys Community School District website www.mstm.us. If you would rather complete a paper copy of the survey, they are available in any of the district administrative offices. Your completed survey should be returned to the administrative offices and we'd like to have the completed surveys by the end of September, so we can tabulate the results and share the findings with you later this fall. Surveys will also be available at early fall school activities, such as football and volleyball games.

Scholarships

Scholarship information is available in the Counseling office for any senior interested in scholarship assistance for college. Talk to the guidance secretary, Mrs. Gegner or the counselor for more information.

SEPTEMBER:

1. Register for fall ACT test, if you are planning to go to a four year university in the fall of 2012.
2. Make sure you meet the admissions requirements of the college that you are interested in. Change your schedule in the counseling office if you need to take extra courses.
3. Double check college admissions deadlines.
4. Start the process of getting recommendation letters from teachers and/or people who know you.
5. Search for scholarships online and review the scholarship notebook.
6. If planning on playing sports in college, be sure you register ASAP with the NCAA Clearinghouse at www.ncaaclearinghouse.net

OCTOBER:

1. Make final decisions on possible colleges.
2. Complete college applications, paying close attention to early admission deadlines.
3. Request teacher and/or counselor recommendations if needed.
4. Request transcripts from the counseling office as needed.
5. Attend college sponsored campus visit programs.
6. Search for scholarships online and through the scholarship notebook.
7. Take ACT or ACT tests. Make sure that the official scores are sent by the testing company to the colleges or universities that have made your final list of schools.
8. Register with the Selective Service if you are a male and 18 years old.

Junior Year Responsibilities

1. Attend College Night....October 5th @ 6:30pm in the Media Center.
2. Take the PSAT/NMSQT on October 12th.
3. Register for the spring SAT or ACT.
4. Take Advance Placement exams (if eligible) in May.
5. Review college options, requirements, and deadlines for admission, housing, financial aid, and scholarships to begin preparing to narrow college choices. Pay close attention to admission deadlines.
6. Visit college campuses on interest, if possible.
7. Register with NCAA Clearinghouse if you plan on being a college student athlete for Division I or II schools. Registration can be completed online at www.ncaaclearinghouse.net

From the Desk of Mr. Moser,
Curriculum Director / English Dept.

It doesn't seem that long ago that I was teaching my classes for the very first time to a group of eager learners in my first classroom at MStM (which is now the ICN room). Twelve years later, I find myself in a room across the hall from the ICN room, ready to begin working with another group of eager learners. A lot has changed for me in those twelve years (parenthood, a Masters degree, new career aspirations, to name a few), and I am just as excited to begin this school year as I was when I first started here.

To begin the year, students in each class work together to create classroom norms that will serve as the rules and expectations for the year. Then students complete a learning styles inventory online. This is done in an effort to foster collaboration between the students – as well as the instructor – in building a high-functioning and productive classroom. High expectations and knowledge of learning preferences will increase the effectiveness of all we do in our work.

All students in my classes will be assessed using a standards-based grading process. Each class has a separate set of skills and competencies that will serve as the learning objectives for each assignment, exam, and project. The standards used come directly from the Common Core State Standards, which has been mandated for use in all high school classrooms for the 2012-2013 school year. The reason for this process is to provide more usable data on progress and performance in key areas (reading comprehension, critical thinking, analysis, and writing) so as to maximize every student's access to appropriately challenging and enriching material. The standards and the grading criteria can be viewed on my course Web site landing page (<http://mstmhsla.pbworks.com>).

This fall semester I will be facilitating English II, American Ideas, Composition, and Literacy Enrichment in classroom. In addition to the several dozen students learning in the traditional classroom environment, there are a few dozen students taking various courses in an independent study format. This flexible approach to instruction ensures all students have equitable access to the curriculum while being

able to pursue learning opportunities in other venues (college courses and school-to-work, for example) as well as overcoming the complexities of our schedule. In all classes students will work with a variety of technology tools to enhance and demonstrate their learning. Some of the new technology components include Twitter, EdModo, GoogleDocs, and others, which can be found on the course Web site landing page listed above.

The means by which students learn may have changed since we were in high school, but the importance of learning has not. Please visit the course Web sites, follow me on Twitter, email or call me with questions or concerns, and stop by the classroom any time. As I tell my students, "My door is always open." I am looking forward to this year and the opportunities it holds for the students at MStM.

The Power of Family Dinners

You can help your children avoid substance abuse simply by having dinner with them on a regular basis. By routinely sharing a meal with your children you are creating a time and place where you can show your interest in—and they can open up about—what's happening in their lives. And that's the start of something good.

The National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse (CASA) at Columbia University has conducted more than a decade of research on the positive influence of families having regular dinners together. The findings are consistent: The more often you have dinner with your kids, the less likely they are to smoke, drink, or use drugs. Not only that, but kids who have regular family dinners are also more likely to get better grades, have better relationships with their parents, and avoid friends who smoke, drink, or use drugs.

The research has shown that teens that have fewer than three family dinners a week are more than twice as likely to say they expect to experiment with drugs compared with teens that have dinner with their families from five to seven times a week.

Time to Eat, Time to Talk

Modern life is busy with parents and children going off in a dozen different directions. Family dinner can be the time and place where our lives intersect and when everyone can take a break from all the activity and interact. CASA and its Family Day project offer some guidelines on making family dinners successful.

Start early and encourage participation.

Establish a regular pattern of family dinners when your children are young and encourage your children to participate

in family meals by having them help create the menus and take part in preparing the meals.

Shut out distractions and talk. At the start of the meal, shut off distractions, including television and phones. Then during the meal, talk about such topics as what happened in each person's day, what's going on in school, the day's events at work, and current events from the news. Keep the conversations positive and supportive and make sure everyone gets a chance to talk.

Establish routines. To ensure meals together are a continuing part of family life, establish routines. Lighting candles might be a good way to signal the start of the meal, and telling a story can come at the end of a meal. After dinner, find ways to keep the conversation going by lingering over dessert or playing a board game together.

Family Day

CASA's Family Day—A Day to Eat Dinner with Your Children™ is a national movement to inform parents “that the engagement fostered during frequent family dinners is an effective tool to help keep America's kids substance free.” Family Day is celebrated on the fourth Monday in September.
